

# Preparation of Papers for Journal of Communication Engineering

Authors' affiliation, Job title and address including telephones and e-mails

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**Abstract**— These instructions give you guidelines for preparing papers for the Journal of Communication Engineering. Use this Microsoft Word document as a template. Each paper must have an abstract of between 150 to 200 words and should be of at least 8 pages. All figures and tables should be placed on top of the pages.

**Index Terms**— Up to five key words in alphabetical order, separated by commas.

## I. INTRODUCTION

The official language of the Journal of Communication Engineering (JCE) is English. All articles will be electronically submitted, peer-reviewed for technical content and acceptability for publication by JCE. Papers submitted for consideration must not have been previously published. All manuscripts must be accompanied by the Copyright signed by the corresponding author before processing of the manuscript can begin.

## II. GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING YOUR PAPER

The paper should be of at least 8 pages. Acceptable format for the text is Microsoft *Word* (word 2003). The text should be Times New Roman and typed in one column of A4 size (21 x 29.7 cm) with one and a half line spacing. All margins should be set to 2.54 cm. All sections, equations, figures, tables and references must be numbered throughout the text. Section titles should be left justified and numbered with roman numbers: I, II, etc. Subsection titles should be left justified and numbered with capital letters: A, B, etc. The style to use throughout the paper is listed in Table I.

The final version of the accepted paper will not be formatted by the Journal staff and will be published as it is. So, follow these types as closely as you can.

### A. Equation

Use the Microsoft Equation Editor for all math objects in your paper. When numbering equations, enclose numbers in parentheses and align with the right margin of the column.




Fig. 1. Simulated and measured return loss for the proposed antenna

### B. Figures and tables

Figures and tables should be inserted in the text body and centered. Figure captions should be below the figures and centered, as shown in Fig. (1); Table captions should be placed above the table. When referring to a figure use *Fig.* For numbering tables use roman numerals.

Colored figures are acceptable. Each figure must occupy no more than half of a page.
